Applications are invited for a temporary Pastoral Care Worker based at Ulladulla High School. The successful candidate will join the school's Wellbeing Team and should be available for a start January 22, 2021.

Position Information

Ulladulla High School is a large co–educational rural coastal community school on the south coast of NSW, drawing students from a large rural area from Termeil in the south to Jerrawangala in the north. 1150 students are enrolled at Ulladulla High School. In 2021 we will have 12 support classes in our Milumba unit. Our school's FOEI (family occupation and education index) value is 106 compared with the NSW average of 100. Higher FOEI values indicate greater disadvantage. 65% of our students are in the lower 2 Quarters of the FEOI and 54% of our parents are substantially tradespeople, clerks and skilled office, sales and service, business managers, arts/media/sportspersons and associate professionals. There is a significant enrolment of Aboriginal Students (5.4%).

About the Role

The school is working toward the establishment of a Wellbeing Sanctuary to address the issue of poor access to support services for families in our community. The Pastoral Care Worker will work as an integral part of the school's Wellbeing Team.

The Pastoral Care Worker's role is to work as part of the Wellbeing Team. As part of the Wellbeing Team, the Pastoral Care Worker assists in the coordination of child and family support agencies and other government agencies.

The Pastoral Care Worker will be required to support small groups of students and provide appropriate resources for use by the Wellbeing team for identified social and personal issues and concerns.

Essential Requirements

- Cert. IV in Youth Work or Pastoral Care or equivalent qualifications.
- Experience working with vulnerable people and referral to services.
- Working with Children Check

- Emergency Care and Anaphylaxis Online training completed.
- Mental Health First Aid or willingness to complete
- In addition to meeting the minimum qualification requirements, a Pastoral Care Worker for the purposes of this program is an individual who is recognised:
 - a. by the school community and the appropriate governing authority for the school as having the skills and experience to deliver school chaplaincy to the school community
 - b. through formal ordination, commissioning, recognised religious qualifications or endorsement by a recognised or accepted religious institution.
 Endorsement of a chaplain by a recognised religious institution can be undertaken at a local level (eg. a local church that is part of a larger entity), where appropriate.
