- 1. We no longer have a 'minimum' academic requirement to join the NSW Police Force.
- We have introduced the University Certificate in Workforce Essentials (UCWE). The programme must be completed **before** lodging a police application with the NSW Police Force. To **PREPARE** and learn more please visit our <u>UCWE</u> page.
- 3. Our literacy and reasoning assessment is now known as the Police Entrance Exam. Applicants can **PREPARE** and take the tests before lodging a police application. To **PREPARE** and learn more please visit the <u>Police Entrance Exam</u> page.
- 4. **PREPARE** and copy your education qualification transcripts and education certificates. Have the copies certified by a Justice of the Peace. This includes your UCWE completion documents.

- 6. Complete the on-line police application with JobsNSW. Scan and upload the copies of your certified education qualification transcripts, education certificates and mandatory documents.
- 7. Once an application is received by the Police Recruitment Branch a case officer will be in contact.

Joining the NSW Police Force is a desirable career and recruitment requirements include successfully achieving various background checks, traffic history review, physical capacity testing, psychometric assessment, medical and interview panel.
